The day was full of excellent strategies and tools that staff can use in their classrooms and in their daily interactions with students to support the building of positive and supportive relationships aimed at placing students in the most optimum position for learning. Reminder - Family Split Billing Arrangements

All parents of students at the College are liable for the payment of their child's essential education item charges.

Any agreement/arrangement between parents of students at the College regarding the liability for payments is separate from the College and the College has no role in facilitating such agreements/arrangements. It is not for the College to become involved in the allocation of financial responsibility between parents.

As a result, the College is no longer able to support split billing arrangements on family accounts. The primary parent will be invoiced and it is the responsibility of both parents to come to an arrangement to settle their child's account.

Student accident insurance, ambulance cover arrangements and private property brought to school

Parents and guardians are reminded that the Department of Education and Surf Coast Secondary College do not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students.

Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department of Education and Surf Coast Secondary College do not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage.

This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises.

As the Department of Education and Surf Coast Secondary College do not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property, students and staff should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.

HotSpot Usage at SCSC

It has come to our attention that students have been using mobile phones as an internet source and accessing gaming websites that are in breach of our Digital Learning policies. Students are reminded that use of a network outside of the EduStar network provided by the College is strictly prohibited.

Digital Agreements signed by families state acceptable online behaviour and usage. EduStar is the only acceptable internet source for students, as the safety of our students online is paramount.

A reminder that any student who is using an alternative internet source, such as a mobile phone hotspot is in breach of the signed Digital Learning Agreement, and may lead to significant device usage restrictions if being used during school hours. We take the safety of our students online very seriously and we appreciate the support of our community in keeping our students safe and productive online.

Public Bus Travel


We would like to thank all the students who are currently travelling on public transport services with a generally positive attitude and who behave respectfully. Although we have a great group of students using these services we are also faced with a few students who don't always make the right choice.

We would like to remind all families that MYKI cards are required for travel and they must be loaded with credit prior to travel. Yearly and half-yearly MYKI cards are available for purchase if you would like to make the top-up process easier. McHarry's services are not contracted by the College and they reserve the right to refuse students for travel and Audit student travel regularly. During an Audit, the Contractor can serve fines to students who do not pay for their travel.

Parking/ Pick Up Information

Ensuring our students are safe is a priority to all the staff at SCSC. Outside of school hours, during our drop off and pick up times, there is a lot of traffic in quite a small area.

To improve the flow of traffic and to ensure the safety of our students during this time we ask that you follow the advice from the Surf Coast Shire.

During the drop-off/pick-up times please use the preferred option of the turning circle on the eastern side of Grant Pavilion (accessed via Yallock Circuit off Merrig Drive). It's a far quieter option, just as close to the main school buildings and there is much less of a risk for pedestrians.

In addition, we remind families that parking is not permitted in the two disability car parks at the front of the College unless you are the holder of a valid disability parking permit. If you use these parking spaces without a valid parking permit you run the risk of receiving a ticket.

Surrounding Roadworks

Please be mindful of the ongoing roadworks that are surrounding the College. The South Beach Road Roundabout is now under construction, please be mindful of the changed traffic conditions. Check out the [Regional Roads Information](#) outlining the updates and detours for this route. South Beach Road will be closed until December 2019.

South Beach Rd roundabout Notification of works

We're improving safety in Torquay, with a new roundabout at Surfcoast Highway, South Beach Road and Messmate Road - as part of the Victorian Government's commitment to Towards Zero.

To build the new roundabout, we're installing new drains on Messmate and South Beach roads between 15 – 24 May, with major construction set to commence in June.

Detours will be in place

To install new drainage for the roundabout, we need to close Messmate Road (15 – 17 May) and South Beach Road (20 – 24 May).

Detours will be in place during working hours, 7am – 5pm, Monday to Friday.

Messmate Road detour

If you usually access Surfcoast Highway via Messmate Road, you'll be redirected to Coombes Road.



South Beach Road detour

We will detour South Beach Road traffic along Horseshoe Bend Road and Blackgate Road.

We ask that you plan ahead and allow a little more time to reach your destination on schedule.

Construction of the new roundabout will start in June

Once the new drainage has been installed, we will start earthworks and construction for the new roundabout.

To enable construction to proceed safely and efficiently, we need to close Messmate Road and South Beach Road until towards the end of the year.


Detours (as shown) will be in place from May - December.

Traffic management

Surfcoast Highway will remain fully open throughout the works; however traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction during the main construction of the roundabout.

Reduced speed limits of 40km/h and some lane closures will be required throughout the construction zone.

WHAT'S ON AT SCSC?

Professional Learning – Berry Street Education Model

We had our third professional learning day for the year on Friday 16th August. The entire staff, both teaching and education support staff, participated in the first of four days training in the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM). The BSEM provides training, curriculum and strategies that strengthen the educational outcomes for all students, including those who have suffered from the effects of stress or trauma. It is based on principles of positive education, trauma-informed and wellbeing practices that enable students' academic and personal growth. Friday's session focused on the 'Body' domain, where staff learned strategies to support students to de-escalate their stress responses and to teach them skills to develop their ability to self-regulate in order to engage more effectively in their learning.



Lions Youth of the Year

On Thursday 22nd August two of our Year 11 students, Max Neal and Lily Watterson, competed in the Torquay Lions Youth of the Year competition. This annual competition is designed to encourage, foster and develop leadership, in conjunction with other citizenship qualities. Entrants complete an interview with the judging panel and then during a dinner meeting with the entire club, engage in a public speaking contest in which they present a prepared speech and also deliver two impromptu responses to unseen topics. Lily delivered a speech about the importance of voluntary euthanasia, while Max spoke passionately about the need to change Australia's national anthem. The impromptu topics asked students to discuss both advantages and disadvantages of the mobile phone ban due to be implemented in Victorian schools next year, while the second topic asked students to consider how Torquay could better market itself to appeal to the increasing number of international tourists arriving in the region via Avalon Airport. Both students were outstanding, with them receiving highly complimentary feedback from the judges. Lily was declared the overall winner and will move on to compete at Zone level early in 2020.

The Torquay Lions Club offers a great deal of support to Surf Coast Secondary College and we're proud and grateful to continue our connection with the club through involvement in the Lions Club Youth of the Year competition.

Year 10 2020 Information Evening Recap

Year 9 students are beyond excited to be thinking and planning their pathways and we were so glad to share in this excitement at our 2020 Year 10 Parent Information night on Monday. Over 150 students and parents fought against the cold winds outside and came along to learn, discuss and plan for 2020. It was so great to see our community unite together to guide our amazing students towards their future!

Over the night we discussed:

a) The Year 10 program: The Year 10 program is designed as a stepping stone between middle school and VCE/VCAL. Students work in a FUSE-like environment for Maths and English in pods and then move into their electives in a similar way as VCE and VCAL. The program also weaves in community connections and student's passions and interests.

b) Work Experience in Year 10: We invite all students to complete a week of work experience in Year 10 as a taster for possible pathways. We invite families to investigate careers of family and friends to build connections to organise a week of work placement. We also suggest that they don't complete this work experience in their part-time job, but look at alternative pathways. They can complete this at any time in the year, the last two weeks of term two often work well!

c) The Subject selection process: Students have been working with their mentor teachers at school and families at home to choose their 2020 subjects and they will enter these via an online form. Canvas Learning Management System for 2020

Surf Coast SC has always been considered both internally, within our own learning environment and community, and externally with other schools and system involvement, as a school that leads the way with innovative and up-to-date use of digital learning.

For the past three years, SCSC has been utilising Compass as our Student Information System (SIS) that assists us with keeping and sharing important student records, tracking student wellbeing, doing daily tasks like marking the role and also assessing and reporting on the progress of learning over time.

However, Compass is not a one-stop-shop for all of our needs in the digital learning space. As a result, Surf Coast SC staff and students have also been using the Google Suite of online learning tools, including Google Classroom as well as a vast array of other web-based tools such as Weebly to manage, disseminate and communicate learning tasks/resources and give feedback to students.

This year, the College has undertaken a review of the current online systems in place to support learning and wellbeing at the College and come to the conclusion that whilst Compass will remain a valuable tool for us as a SIS that supports the management and tracking of students, that we needed to improve the way that the learning and teaching was being delivered online.

As a result, we have investigated different solutions and met with different third-party vendors that are what we would call a Learning Management System. We were searching for a product that would allow us to continue to utilise the power of the Google Suite of tools, be intuitive for all stakeholders to use, enhance assessment, reporting and feedback and generally improve processes by putting everything in one place as much as we can.

We came to the Conclusion that CANVAS was the product that can help us achieve these aims. This was done through demonstrations to some students and also to all staff and feedback opportunities. There was a positive consensus that introduction of Canvas would be a positive change.

The proposal to add the use of Canvas as a Learning Management System, alongside Compass as our SIS, was shared with School Council on June 18. School Council endorsed this proposal.

Of course, this will be a big change for all stakeholders, but one that we believe will ultimately benefit us all and most importantly, student learning. The rollout of Canvas in SCSC will look as follows (timelines may be amended over time as the implementation progresses):

Term 3, 2019 – system is set up and key leadership staff trialling and setting up templates in the system for classes

Term 4, 2019 – staff training and time to set up classes for 2020

Term 1 and 2 2020 – students introduced to the system and begin use. Reporting to still be conducted on Compass (TBC)

Term 3 2020 – parents to be introduced to Canvas. Ideally reporting to be completed on Canvas in semester 2 (TBC)

There will be training and support materials for all stakeholders

Obligation to hold valid ticket for T3, T5, T6, T7, T10, T11 school bus travel

It is a requirement that Surf Coast Secondary College students travelling on any of the 'T' school buses or route 50 or 51 must use a MYKI card to pay their fare every time they travel.

MYKI cards can be purchased and topped up on the bus up to a maximum of \$20, online at www.ptv.vic.gov.au, in person at staffed train stations or at 7 Eleven stores or by calling PTV on 1800 800 007.

An economical way to pay is to purchase a MYKI pass or Victorian Student Travel Pass which can be loaded onto your MYKI, eliminating the requirement to keep topping up the card (great for regular travellers). Visit mcharrys.com.au or ptv.vic.gov.au for more information.

Travelling without a valid MYKI is fare evasion and is against the law. Authorised Officers regularly travel on McHarry's buses and will issue a \$70.00 on the spot fine for a child without a valid ticket.
